

Updates posted on June 30, 2026

The Committee changed the text of two instructions:

Inst. 10.05 Health Care Fraud (18 U.S.C. § 1347)

In paragraph (2)(D), the definition of “willfully” was corrected to require knowledge of the law based on *United States v. Singh*, 147 F.4th 652 (6th Cir. 2025).

Inst. 15.04 Aggravated Identity Theft (18 U.S.C. § 1028A(a)(1))

In paragraph (2)(E), the definition of “during and in relation to” was adjusted in view of *United States v. King*, 126 F.4th 440 (6th Cir. 2025).
